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Today, we are living in a world where there is no barrier between the countries. The development of the transportation enabled people to move around the world and live away from their home countries. This triggered the beginning of the multi-cultural society all around the world. Korea is also becoming and is already one of those societies with the increasing number of international marriage families. However, this phenomenon brought about another social problem, which can be inferred from the passage B, discrimination of multi-cultural families. The reason why multi-cultural families are being discriminated can be deduced from the characteristics of human.

According to passage A, human only tends to believe what they think is right and deny anything that is different from their thinking. Koreans have traditionally emphasized the only 'pedigree' and because most Koreans think that one-cultural society is important and only try to see people in this sense, multi-cultural people living in Korea are standing nowhere.

Also by directly providing the proper welfare for multi-cultural families such as financial help in children's



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education , job opportunities, it will reduce the psychological stress multi-culture families get.

In conclusion , the key in eradicating the discrimination for multi-cultured families in Korean society is the change in people's perspective. And this can be done by educating people and providing a good welfare for multi-cultured families. We all need to remember that there is no difference in people that we are all the same regardless of the race.
